WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Today the Church throughout the world prays for vocations. Will you make a special effort to ask the Lord for vocations to the priesthood and religious life? Pray for the priests who have ministered to you throughout your life, both living and dead. Encourage your children, grandchildren, or other young people to consider a vocation as a priest or religious brother or sister. Pray a rosary for more young men and women in our diocese to respond to God's call.

Pray for Vocations!

As Catholics, we firmly believe that God has a plan for our lives! He calls some to marriage, some to the priesthood, and others to religious life or to live as generous single people. Fully living our own vocations—and teaching young people how to discern God's call—is a serious duty, but also a joyful one. During this week, please encourage the young people in your life—children, grandchildren, students, and friends—to be open if God calls them to priesthood or religious life.

Teach Your Children to Use GPS

After Mass today, have a conversation with your children, asking, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" After a few moments of discussion, ask, "Who do you think God wants you to be when you grow up?" Emphasize to your children that God has a specific plan in mind for them, and that following God's plan is the surest way to happiness. Every life decision—which college to attend, whom to date, which job to pursue, whether to enter seminary, whom to marry—should be undertaken only after praying for God's guidance. In other words, encourage kids to navigate life using GPS—God's Positioning System.

FR PETER MAHER R.I.P.

Fr Peter helped out in the parish as a supply priest he has died recently, may he rest in peace

Pope Francis describes Christians as 'missionary disciples'. The Church, in every time and in every

place, is a missionary and those who follow and learn from the teaching and example given by Christ are disciples. Fr Peter Maher knew himself to be both a missionary and a disciple. He responded to the call to follow Christ as a member of St Joseph's Missionary Society of Mill Hill and he was ordained as a priest of that Society on 13 June 1970.

Fr Peter Maher was born in Blackburn, Lancashire on 4 November 1944, after secondary education, he then went to St Joseph's College in Holland, and returned to England in 1966 to study at the Missionary Institute of London. After ordination as a Mill Hill Missionary his studies continued at West Hill College, Birmingham. He decided to be incardinated into the Diocese of Westminster, and was received on 29th September 1975. After serving for many years in the Diocese of Westminster, due to health issues he was advised to take time away from parish ministry. But he remained active and provided supply ministry in parishes in the area, especially for us here in Baldock; this was greatly appreciated by priests and parishioners in the local area. In August 2022 Fr Peter was diagnosed as having advanced cancer. The prayers and support of family and friends, and his robust faith, gave him strength and courage as he bore his illness. The Lord took Fr Peter on Holy Thursday, 6 April when he died peacefully in Bedford Hospital having been admitted six days earlier. Holy Thursday is the day that priests renew their priestly promises and it was apt that the Lord took him to himself on that day.

Fr Peter will be remembered as being 'down to earth' and always having a clear idea of what he wanted to do, when and how. He encouraged the active involvement of parishioners in the life and work of the various parishes where he served. He was blessed with a strong voice that gave encouragement to others when singing in church. He touched the lives of many parishioners in the dioceses of Westminster and Northampton. He made many lasting friendships among priests and parishioners. May his soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

ST CATHERINE OF SIENA

Born in 1347, with a Feast Day on 29th April, the day she died, she was one of 25. The Patron Saint of Europe. Italy, nurses, the sick, and those ridiculed for their piety, she is invoked against fires, miscarriages, and temptations. Canonized by Pope Pius II on June 29, 1461, she was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI on October 4, 1970, being proclaimed Co-Patron of Europe by Pope John Paul II on 1st October, 1999.
