Reflection on todays reading.

Jeremiah 20: 1-13; Psalm 68 (69); Romans 5: 12-15; Matthew 10: 26-33

Jesus instructed the Twelve: 'Do not be afraid'. Grant, O Lord, that we may always revere and love your holy name, for you never deprive of your guidance those you set firm on the foundation of your love.

Today's readings are very apt for our current times, where many of us are experiencing vulnerability, tension, and unpredictability. Yet as followers of Christ, we are being called to trust in God our Father, who knows us intimately and understands our needs.

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds the Twelve that they are not promised success; they will suffer. Yet he bids them repeatedly: 'Do not be afraid'. The Father's tender care will never desert them as God is on their side: not as a remote figure, but as a Father who has intimate knowledge of and care for each of them.

In these our own times of trial and vulnerability, we pray for God's guidance and teaching. 'Lord, you invite us to cry out with complete confidence in the Father's boundless love. This day we offer you praise and thanks for your abundant gifts to us in our poverty and weakness.'

The Nativity of John the Baptist



This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist. You may be asking yourself what is so important about John the Baptist that we honour his birth? We honour Jesus' birth at Christmas and Mary's birth on the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, but why John the Baptist? Well, if you remember, Jesus said: "I tell you, among those born of women no one is greater than John" (Lk 7:28). Jesus honoured John above all other men and so it is fitting that we honour him too.

Jesus and Mary were both set aside for a special purpose before they were born and so was John

the Baptist. Every human life is valuable and precious in God's eyes. We should remember to pray for all expectant mothers and fathers, that they come to love their little baby that they have not yet been able to see. This would be a good thing for us to do today, in honour of Saint John the Baptist's birthday.

ST JOHN SOUTHWORTH

Has his Feast Day this week and is one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. He studied at the English College in Douai, in northern France. (The college later relocated to St Edmund's College, in Ware.) Having been arrested on 6 previous occasions, spending much of his time in The Clink in London, he was eventually tried under the Elizabethan anti-priest legislation, pleaded guilty and was executed in London. He is now laid to rest in Westminster Cathedral and in 2014, The Guild of Saint John Southworth was established in Westminster Cathedral. Its members are volunteers who will meet visitors, answer their questions and guide them around the cathedral if they wish. This service is free
