MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity. It is also our patronal feast; we are named after the Holy Trinity and St Augustine of Canterbury whose feast day was on the 27th May. The mystery of the Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, and the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the hierarchy of the truths of faith. The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is revealed to humankind, and reconciles and unites with those who turn to Him.

The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God. To be sure, God has left traces of his Trinitarian being in his work of creation and in his Revelation throughout the Old Testament. But his inmost Being as Holy Trinity is a mystery that is inaccessible to reason alone or even to Israel's faith before the Incarnation of God's son and the sending of the Holy Spirit.

But we can have some knowledge of the Trinity in what is called the *economy of salvation*; the way God saves us in becoming man and taking on Himself the sins of the whole world. Jesus expressed his love for his Father by always doing his will, even that which was so difficult, by giving up his life for us on the cross.

On a practical level we can see that the Trinity is the model for all our human relationships. There exists within the Trinity a complete loving community of three persons who live in harmony with each other. God is one, but also three persons; who exist in communion with each other. This loving existence of the Trinity is a model of the Church and how we ought to live out our Christian lives within the community of God. We already model the divine life of the Trinity, who is given to us at our baptism and lives within us, at the deepest level of our being. God is really very close to us. We know this through faith and we experience it when we actually mirror the love of the Trinity by loving each other. Let us ask God this Trinity Sunday for the grace to be drawn deeper into the life of that loving community of the Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Fr. Denis

THE HOLY TRINITY

Pope Francis speaks about the Trinity has spoken about the love that is at the heart of the divine life of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is, he said, "a life of profound communion and perfect love, the origin and end of the whole universe

and of every creature." But the Holy Trinity is also the model of the Church "in which we are called to love one another as Jesus has loved us." God, the Pope said, "is close to us, He is always by our side, He walks with us to share our joys and our sorrows, our hopes and our struggles." He loves human beings so much that He sent His only Son, the Second Person of the Trinity, into the world, that the world might be saved through Jesus.

It is the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Risen Jesus," that "communicates the divine life to us and so makes us enter into the dynamism of the Trinity, a dynamism of love, of communion, of reciprocal service, of sharing." A person, a family, a parish that loves others for the sake of love is a "reflection of the Trinity." But although true love is without limits, true love also knows when to limit itself in order "to meet the other, to respect the liberty of the other. *Pope Francis*
