A WORD FROM THE ARCHIBISHOP VINCENT In the last few weeks we have been blessed with three ordination ceremonies, receiving in total five new deacons and five new priests. I welcome them all and give thanks to God for their vocations, their gift of themselves to ministry, and for the work done by their formation staff. It is good too that there are more men in formation at Allen Hall, in Rome, at Valladolid, and in the permanent diaconate programme. Each is answering the Lord's call to come and work in his vineyard. The Vocations team and those responsible for the permanent diaconate are encouraging and supporting a number of other people discerning their possible futures as well as promoting vocations. I am grateful as always for the work that they do. As the prayer for the ordinations of a priest says, 'our need is great'. I need not remind you that the best promoter of vocations is each and every one of us: bishops, priests, deacons, religious sisters, and, of course, families themselves. We are all called to be living witnesses in the world to the Gospel by our life and example. It is through us that God works in the world and it is through us that people will come to know the plan, the vocation, God has for them. Finding and following that plan is the path to profound happiness. Many of those coming forward to offer themselves say that the witness and words of encouragement from a priest were key factors in their vocation. In so many ways we can sow precious seeds which produce a rich harvest. Please do all you can to promote and encourage vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate and to the religious life by planting the seed.

I hope that in the coming weeks we can all find some time for rest or a holiday, to recharge our batteries and renew our strength. For some of our priests and deacons it will be a time for change, be it retirement or a change of parish and responsibilities.
