God's all-inclusive hospitality

If people were asked what they most like about Christmas, I suspect many would mention sitting at table for Christmas dinner with family. It's a moment for rising above any family tensions and joyfully celebrating together our deeper bonds. Absent and deceased family members are remembered and sometimes relatives and friends who are alone are invited to share this special family meal. On Christmas Day we want people to feel they belong and are included.

Jesus, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, had a deep sense of the hospitality of God, His Father, who invited all to sit at his table. It seems Jesus rarely refused an invitation to a meal, with the result that some called him a glutton and a wine drinker! But what was really unusual was his willingness to sit at table with the outcasts of society. This was Jesus's way of saying that all are invited to experience unconditional love and acceptance as members of God's family. When we come to the Lord's Table we experience God's welcome for all, and commit ourselves to be messengers and channels of God's all-inclusive hospitality. Being present at Christmas Mass is also a special moment. If you have returned home for Christmas; or if you don't normally come to Mass, a warm welcome to you. I pray that in our families and parish we will experience the joy of God's loving welcome, through Jesus whose birth we celebrate today. Happy Christmas! Fr Denis

Christmas Reflection

I behold a new and wondrous mystery. My ears resound to the Shepherds' song, piping no soft melody, but chanting full forth a heavenly hymn. The Angels sing. The Archangels blend their voice in harmony. The Cherubim hymn their joyful praise. The Seraphim exalt His glory. All join to praise this holy feast, beholding the Godhead here on earth, and man in heaven. He who is above, now for our redemption dwells here below; and he that was lowly is by divine mercy raised. Bethlehem this day resembles heaven; hearing from the stars the singing of angelic voices; and in place of the sun, enfolds within itself on every side, the Sun of Justice. And ask now how; for where God wills, the order of nature yields. For He willed, He had the power, He descended, He redeemed; all things move in obedience to God.

"But what shall I say? What shall I utter? *Behold an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger*. Mary is present, who is both Virgin and Mother, Joseph is present, who is called father. He is called husband, she is called wife. The names indeed are lawful, but there is no other bond. We speak here of words, not of things. He was espoused to her, but the Most High overshadowed her. Hence, Joseph, doubting, knew not what to call the Infant. He would not dare to say that it was conceived in adultery; he could not speak harshly against the Virgin; he shrank from calling the Child his own. He knew well that here was something unknown to him; how or whence was this Child born? And being anxious because of this, there came to him a message, by the voice of an angel, which said: *Fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife, for that which is conceived in her, is of the Holy Spirit*."

"He, who sits upon the sublime and heavenly Throne, now lies in a manger. And He Who cannot be touched, who is simple, without complexity, and incorporeal, now lies subject to the hands of men. He, who has broken the bonds of sinners, is now bound by an infant's bands."
