And Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; rise, he is calling you." And throwing off his mantle he sprang up and came to Jesus. And Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" And the blind man said to him, "Master, let me receive my sight." And Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way.

This weekend our Lord Jesus is calling each one of us personally, He is looking for us to respond to His call, a call to follow him each day with love and faith. We need to 'encounter' the living Christ in the same way as the blind person in today's Gospel. Have you ever encountered a once in a life-time opportunity you knew you could not pass up? Such a moment came for the blind and destitute man, Bartimaeus. He was determined to get near the one person who could meet his need. Why did Jesus however put a question to Bartimaeus - "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus wanted to draw out of him a personal response of faith and trust in his power to heal and make whole. Jesus commends Bartimaeus for recognising who he is with the eyes of faith and grants him physical sight as well. This coming week may we recognise the Lord Jesus to strengthen your faith that you may draw near to him and receive his grace and mercy.

"Our time calls us, urges us, obliges us to gaze on the Lord and immerse ourselves in humble and devout meditation on the mystery of the supreme power of Christ himself. ... The absolute and yet sweet and gentle power of the Lord responds to the whole depths of the human person, to his loftiest aspirations of intellect, will and heart. It does not speak the language of force but expresses itself in charity and truth. ...So often today man does not know what is within him, in the depths of his mind and heart. So often he is uncertain about the meaning of his life on this earth. He is assailed by doubt, a doubt which turns into despair. We ask you therefore, we beg you with humility and trust, let Christ speak to man. He alone has words of life, yes, of eternal life."

Who is the group for?: We welcome all children from Reception to Y6 who attend non-Catholic schools and worship in our parish.

We then break into groups with more focused teaching for KS1 and KS2 children. Our classes aim to give the children an overview of the RE teaching they would receive in a Catholic school.
