

Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be brought low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways shall be made smooth; and all mankind shall see the salvation of God."

This Second Sunday of Advent recalls the expectant faith of John the Baptist. Luke the evangelist tells us that the "word of God came to John in the wilderness" (Luke 3:2). Who was John the Baptist and what is the significance of the word which he received and delivered to the people of his day? Luke tells us that John was the son of Zechariah, a priest who served in the temple at Jerusalem. John stood at a pivotal juncture in the history of God's dealing with his people. He bridged the Old and New Testaments, also known as the Old and New Covenants which God made with his people.

Like John the Baptist, we too here in Barnet are called to prepare, even during these uncertain times, for the arrival of the Saviour. How did John prepare for the coming of the Anointed (Messiah) King and Saviour of the world? The Baptiser tells us that the first step is conversion and repentance Conversion involves receiving God's word into our heart and mind and allowing his Word to change our attitudes and wrong ways of thinking and judging. Repentance is the deliberate turning away from sin and turning to God to receive his pardon, healing, and strength to do what is good and right. As a parish on our Advent journey, may we embrace the grace of conversion and repentance.

Advent Quote from the Early Church Fathers: Touching Jesus by faith, by Augustine of Hippo, 430-543 A.D. "Consider the text 'And all flesh shall see the salvation of God' (Luke 3:6). There is no difficulty at all in taking this to mean 'And all flesh shall see the Christ of God.' After all, Christ was seen in the body and will be seen in the body when he comes again to judge the living and the dead
