<u>4th Sept</u> Solemnity of St Gregory the Great 8.30am: Donya Kiani 10.30am: Catherine Malone+ 6.00pm: Bella & Anthony McNamara (ints) Today God is sending us a message about humility, which is supposed to be a characteristic, or better, a virtue in our behaviour as Christians. In today's first reading, the book of Ecclesiasticus, we can read:" My son, be gentle in carrying your business, ... The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly, and then you will find favour with the Lord; for great though the power of the Lord is, he accepts the power of the humble." This statement was explained by Jesus in the form of a parable in our Gospel; "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour...For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted....when you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask friends,...but invite the poor, the crippled, the lame the blind...because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again."

The essence of the reading is: "for everyone who humbles himself will be exalted." But how do we examine our conscience on the virtue of humility? For if we think of ourselves as humble, are we not guilty of that pride witch our Lord set out to condemn? Humility does not mean that we simply think little of ourselves. It means that we recognise the great things that God has done in us. We recognise the truth that we are God's creatures, that we, and all the gifts and talents we possess, belong to him. St Teresa of Avila with a real humility recognised God's gifts in her. She used to say: Humility is to walk in truth". The truth is that we are completely dependent on God and in this modern and technological world we are trying, on the contrary, to be independent of God. We don't need Him, we can deal in our practical life as "grown up "people, everything depending on us.

We should be happy because we are "instruments" in God's hands. He is using us, as a pen, to write, to convey, his truth, justice, service, love... in this aggressive and incomprehensible world. The cleaner, the lighter, the less obtrusive the pen is, the brighter, the cleaner will the writing be, God's writing, God's will through us.

One of the big worries in today's world is the presence of so many wars, especially the one in Ukraine. How can we explain the situation of what is happening there? It looks like a nonsense. Our Pope Francis is trying to intercede, asking continuously God's protection in humility, to prevent more violence. He is going to Kazakhstan for the World Religious Congress next month, although Patriarch Kirill is not going there, as we've have been informed.

Perhaps, if we are humble enough, God will listen to our prayers, using us as instruments, as a simple pen. Let's hope it will happen and, in the meantime, let's help each other in our little word, our parish, our family, to accept in humility the task our Father is offering to us, to increase our dedication to our fellow parishioners, especially to the ones more in need.


#### FEAST OF ST GREGORY THE GREAT CELEBRATIONS
