

Watching out for Christ

Watch therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the householder had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have watched and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

As we enter the sacred Season of Advent, we are called to live our lives in light of Jesus' promise to return again as our Lord and Judge on the final day of judgment. Jesus gives two striking images to illustrate the urgency of the need to not be caught off guard and unprepared when we are suddenly summoned to appear before the Lord. The first image Jesus used is a description of two men working together in the field - very likely close family members or close co-workers. One is suddenly taken away and the other is left. What is striking about this parable is the sudden and unexpected turn of events - a summons to appear before the Judge to hear his verdict on the day of reckoning when he acts to separate the just from the unjust. All who had faith in Jesus Christ receive the just reward of everlasting joy and friendship in his kingdom of righteousness and peace.

Jesus' second story of the thief in the night brings home the necessity for constant watchfulness. While no thief would announce his intention in advance, nor the time when he would strike, lack of vigilance would nonetheless invite disaster for those who do not keep a watchful eye. Satan tries to rob us of our faith in Jesus Christ and the treasure of the kingdom which Christ has won for us.

The Lord Jesus Christ calls us to be alert and watchful for his coming. He comes to us each and every day and he knocks on the door of our heart and home. As a Parish let us listen for his voice and welcome him into our lives.
