What do you hope to see ...?

In each of the last four Sundays, our attention was drawn to the lights of the Advent Wreath. In the readings at the Masses, we listened to the call to repent and make our hearts ready to receive God's promise of salvation to his people.

Today, and until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, (and in the Old Rite, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord) our focus will be on the Word made flesh. The liturgy during this time, with the image of Christmas crib, will help focus our minds and hearts on the Word made flesh. The Christmas crib tradition was borne out of St Francis' desire to relive on Christmas Eve, the memory of the infant born at Bethlehem, in the woods of Greccio near Assisi.

In these days of Christmas, many will visit the Christmas crib in churches or at their homes. What do you hope to see in the crib? A donkey and an ox seemingly looking indifferent to what is happening their manger? An image of a baby asleep on the hay or an image of a man and a woman overtaken by the wonder of what lays before their eyes?

For some, the visit to the Christmas crib will evoke the wonder of what God can do out of love for us. For others, it will elicit a joyful admiration of the baby Jesus wrapped in swaddling cloth ... and the list goes on. However, the Christmas crib represents more than this. In the Christmas crib, we see, not the fantasy of lifeless images, but the hope for our salvation become a living experience. We see a God on whose promise we can rely, even when all else fails us in life. We see an opportunity to return to the One who fulfils the deepest desires of our hearts. We see the love of God for us made flesh.

The promise that the Christmas crib represents also invites us to make our hearts and our world a crib wherein baby Jesus can grow, so that our lives can bear the fruits of humility, love, joy, forgiveness and peace. May we take him into the home of our hearts where he earnestly desires to live in, and not leave to the chill of cold indifference, the One who made himself poor that we may become rich in his grace.
