

# Sacred Heart Church, Berkhamsted



■ 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A, 19<sup>th</sup> November

The readings in this final week of Ordinary Time, Year A, remind us again of the need to be always prepared for the coming of Christ by the way we live our lives.

The writer of today's first reading, uses very poetic and symbolic language to illustrate the virtue of fully employing the talents God gives us. Far from suggesting a recipe for 'perfect wife' at the service of her 'lord-husband.' Although using language which reflects the practice and culture of biblical times, the passage speaks powerfully of the value and dignity of manual work, the importance of charity, and respect for all, whatever their role in life. There is a depth of truth in the rather throwaway line: 'Charm is deceitful, and beauty empty.' Pause on this thought and let it linger on your mind. The final line is a wonderful expression of how the way we live our lives is the best advertisement for our faith - 'let her works tell her praises at the city gates.'

The Psalm speaks again of the dignity of work, of being self-sufficient, providing for one's family, and living in awe of the Lord.

St Paul reminds us in the Second Reading that if we live our lives in the light of Christ, we have no need to fear the coming of the reign of God.

In the Gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the talents to show the importance of making best use of what we have been given for the benefit of others.

This week, we might pray for those who struggle to realise where their own talents lie, and those who lack the opportunity to be recognised, valued and celebrated. We also continue to pray for peace across the world.
