This Sunday, we begin the season of Advent. It is the season of the joyful expectation of the coming Jesus Christ at Christmas, but also a time of holy preparation for his Second Coming. He enjoins us to stay awake for that time unkown to none, not with with wide open eyes, but with our heart and mind attuned to his ways and the things of heaven.

The first reading opens this Advent Season with words that resonate with the sentiments and experience of many around the world today calling for God's intervention and salvation. "Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down! - at your Presence the mountains would melt." In his prayer, the prophet acknowledges the sovereignty of God over all, and expresses great faith in God's power to rescue humanity from its failings and sufferings.

This desparate cry for help did not go unanswered; for God at Christmas intervened by sending his Son, Jesus Christ, who saves the human race from its sinfulness. Even as we await his Second Coming, God never stops intervening, but keeps this stream of divine help flowing into our lives by joining us to his Son Jesus Christ, through Baptism and the Sacrements – seconding reading.

By insisting that we "stay awake", Jesus asks us to show ourselves to be faithful and virtuous stewards of the gift of life that God enstrusted to us to nurture in his ways; and for which accountability will be demanded of us. One way of staying awake is by rediscovering prayer in our lives, as this Adevent, we begin the Year of Prayer 2024, designated by Pope Francis. "The Year of Prayer is not a year about prayer, but a year for prayer. The image of Christ in the manger speaks of a God who wants an intimate realtionship with His creation." "'Come therefore,' my heart says, 'seek his face!'" (Ps. 27:8)
