

## 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.'

There are many lessons to be learnt from the readings at Masses since we began this season of Advent. One of them is that to be happy in this and in the life after, or better still, to be blessed in the true sense of the word, we need to cooperate with God in his plan.

Perhaps you would remember that cry of desperation echoed in the first reading of the First Sunday of Advent – "Oh that you would tear the heavens open and come down! At your Presence the mountains would melt..." as the people of God came to the recognition that it was their deviation from the laws and ways of God that brought misery upon them. (Isa. 63:16-17, 64:1, 3-8)

The call to cooperate with God requires a total surrender and trust on our part. Besides the grace of God, we are only able to surrender ourselves if we believe that God's plan for us is for welfare and not for evil, and to give us a future and a hope. (Jeremiah 29:11) Mary is blessed because she not only trusted, (Magnificat, Luke 1:45ff) she also cooperated with God in his plan to redeem humanity from the consequences of its sins.

Another key role model for us on how to surrender and cooperate with God is Joseph, who hardly spoke but was outstanding in his actions. In Matthew's account of how Jesus came to be born, the Evangelist describing his total surrender writes: "When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home." (Matthew 1:24) Imagine what could have happened to the Child-Saviour in the womb of his betrothed; conceived by the power of the Most High God

Mary and Joseph surely understood that it is by aligning ourselves with God's plan that we live a fruitful and blessed life. More so, because they surrendered to and cooperated with God, even non-Christians today celebrate in some ways, in this season of joy. In what ways therefore, might God be asking you to cooperate with him so that the people around you can experience something of God's plan of welfare and a future filled with joy, peace and love in their lives? Can you work with God to be his vehicle of relief to those having difficulties in life; protection in your family and to the vulnerable; and more importantly, to bring his Gift of Jesus Christ into the lives of others?
