## Advent

## a new Year begins in the family of the ChurchFr Peter writes.....

The First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the Church's Year and brings us to start our preparation for Christmas. The world of commerce is already bursting with Christmas in shops and so many other places but the Christian knows that time is needed to prepare ourselves, partly in the desert, before we can cope with all the glitz of commercial Christmas, so, stay strong and stay in Advent until Christmas really does arrive on the night of Christmas Eve!

As a Parish we are invited to join with St Elizabeth's Centre for their special <u>Advent Service of Reflection</u> at <u>4pm on the afternoon of Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> Nov</u> – the First Sunday of Advent – St Elizabeth's hold this Service each year and this year we are particularly invited to begin our Advent with them as a Parish. Please see the poster in each Church. "Each year at St Elizabeth's at the beginning of Advent we pause for an hour to consider the real meaning of Advent. We set aside a time of quiet reflection to prepare ourselves for Christmas. During the service there is an opportunity to light a candle perhaps to remember those who will not be with us this Christmas."

There will also be an <u>Advent Series of Meetings to</u> "Wait on Scripture". These are organised by the Ecumenical partnership of St Andrews C of E and Holy Cross RC who share the Church of St Andrew at Much Hadham. They will take place at the home of one of the congregation. The address is: Berakah, Larkins Lane, off Kettle Green Lane, Much Hadham on <u>Mondays Nov 28<sup>th</sup></u>, <u>Dec 5<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> and Tues Dec 20<sup>th</sup></u>. The meetings are based on Dr Paula Goodier's book "The Meaning of Waiting". Each meeting will last an hour from <u>2pm to 3pm</u> (which enables parents with children to attend)

There will be an introduction, a chance to discuss, and a time of prayer and a cup of tea! We hope it will help you to prepare for the best Christmas ever!
