THE WORD

Year B • Psalter Week 1



Jesus' journey towards Jerusalem and his destiny continues, as does his instruction of the disciples with the second prediction of the suffering which awaits him.

Mark sharpens his rather negative view of this group by presenting them as not only failing to understand but also as being reluctant to ask him to explain. Instead, they get into an argument about the order of ranking amongst themselves. Jesus then sits down, which means that he is teaching officially, and tells them that true greatness consists in service and respecting those whom society regards as not counting for much. He presents them with a child to illustrate his point; here the child does not represent innocence but a person with no rights or standing within the community. There is nothing to be gained by taking notice of a child in the society of that time. By embracing the child, Jesus is performing a symbolic action: he is showing by his attitude and action that God is reaching out to those individuals whom the society of the day does not recognise as worthy of care and respect.

We might note that Jesus is telling his listeners that they should welcome those people whom the child represents as they would welcome Jesus himself, and in this way they will welcome the Father. The apparently insignificant person thus represents Jesus and should be treated with the appropriate honour and respect. The Lord says this most clearly in Matthew's account of the Last Judgement: "Whenever you did this to the least of these, you did it to me."

#### DO

When you are walking through the street, notice the children whom you encounter; notice also the beggars, the homeless. These are the people in whom we should meet and welcome Jesus.

#### DAI

Lord, help me to see others as you see them.

# LEARN

The title "Son of Man" is often linked with the Passion in Mark's version of the Gospel.

Capernaum is the town on the north-west shore of the Sea of Galilee which Jesus made his base when he left Nazareth.

Sitting is the posture proper to a rabbi teaching his disciples; in our liturgy, the proper position for a bishop when he preaches is to sit.

Mountains are places of revelation in the Bible.

### REFLECT

that the Gospel reveals who Jesus really is, and who God really is as well. We find the cross at the heart of Jesus' teaching about what it means to be his disciple. It is all about self-giving, self-sacrifice, and renouncing what people normally understand as power. Jesus may well be Lord and Master, but he does not "lord it" over others. His embrace of the child is not simply affection, but a parable in action, to illustrate what should be the attitude of anyone who claims to be his disciple, to follow his teachings. The noun "authority" comes from the root "to increase": authority should be seen within the Christian community as a service which enables people to grow as persons into the fullness of what it means to be a human being made in the image and likeness of God. Power is a different matter: it can be used for good, or ill, which we usually refer to as an abuse of power or position. The more authority or power a person holds, the more careful they have to be to use it for the purpose for which it is intended. As Christians, we have the example of Jesus to guide our attitudes and actions. Blessed Pope John XXIII regarded the task of church leaders as being "not to look after a museum but to cultivate a flourishing garden of life".
