A reading from the book of Genesis.



Sunday Message THE WORD Year C . Psalter Week 2

The transfiguration of Jesus marks a turning point in the Gospel. The baptism of Jesus revealed him as the Son of God and set the scene for his ministry in Galilee.

The incident in today's Gospel fulfils a similar function, and marks the beginning of his journey towards Jerusalem and his destiny there. Luke presents this as a prayer experience: before any important stage in Jesus' ministry, the evangelist shows him at prayer. At the heart of this vision of Jesus in glory, we find a reference to the passion in the subject of his conversation with Moses and Elijah, where they speak of his "passing" (or "exodus") which he would accomplish in the holy city. This reinforces Jesus' prediction of his suffering and death which he had made a little while before. Glory will follow his obedient suffering. Jesus is also here revealed as the promised prophet like Moses to whom the disciples are told to listen.

One interesting detail we might consider in this story is the movement of the presence of God. The mention of the mountain and the cloud, light and divine voice recall the experiences of Moses and Elijah on Sinai/Horeb. As happened to them, the divine presence comes upon Jesus and the three disciples, and withdraws from them at the end of the experience. Peter wants to pin down the divine presence in some way by constructing three tents. But God is not to be controlled or contained in any human construction. It is only after the Paschal event has been accomplished that the disciples will pass on to others what they have seen, once they have received the Spirit.

LEARN

Moses represents the Law which he received from the Lord on Mount Sinai during the Exodus journey

Elijah represents the Prophets: his mission as God's spokesperson was reconfirmed on Mount Horeb.

Horeb is another name for Sinai, used particularly in the northern kingdom of Israel, where Elijah was a prophet.

The expression "the Law and the Prophets" refers to the main writings of the Hebrew Bible.

DO

Look at the tabernacle in the church. The Catholic tradition tells us that Christ is present in the consecrated bread reserved there. Where else are you aware of Christ present in your life? Set aside some extra time each day this week to think about this: this is prayer.



SAY

It is your face, O Lord, that I seek: hide not your face.

REFLECT

n the early history of Israel, the most important religious object was the ark of the covenant. It represented the presence of the Lord among the people. Its most significant characteristic was that it was mobile, and was taken to different shrines around the territories of the tribes. A carving from a much later synagogue at Capernaum shows the ark as having wheels, which emphasises this aspect. David's proposal to build a Temple in his newly acquired southern

capital of Jerusalem may have been regarded by the northern tribes as a step too far. It might have seemed like localising and fixing the divine presence in the royal capital, and thereby bolstering the monarchy. In the end, David did not pursue his plan, though he did bring the ark to Jerusalem.

We might ponder where we think God is to be found. In the Bible, the writers often wonder about God's apparent

absence. Perhaps the poet is right when he observes that humankind cannot bear very much reality. We might think that it would be easy to believe if Christ were present in glory all the time: maybe today's Gospel is telling us that although we might catch glimpses of this from time to time, we should rather listen to the teachings of Jesus and live by them.
