THANK YOU to the 33 people who came to the Deanery Fire Marshall training on Tuesday.

WHAT DOES A FIRE MARSHALL IN CHURCH DO?

- Looks after an area in the Church which may have to be evacuated and checked, identifying any doors which need to be unlocked or secured before Mass
- Identifies any areas which could cause problems to those with mobility difficulties and knows how to help
- Is aware of the location of Fire blankets, extinguishers and where candles are in use
- Listens and looks out for dangers, signs of fires starting e.g. monitoring votive candle stands or obstructions in aisles or fire exits
- Opens any doors which may trap people if left closed
- Encourages Parishioners to evacuate calmly and quickly
- Gives Parents of Servers and families of the Junior Choir direction to the Assembly point to meet them. **All other Parishioners should leave and move away from the Church. Vehicles and People (either moving or stationary) should not cause an obstruction or a delay to any emergency service vehicles arriving at the Church to deal with the fire or any casualties.**
- Checks that any visitors or disabled persons within their area of responsibility have been cared for and assistance given.
- If safe to do so, confirms their area has been fully evacuated and reports to the Priest in charge

GOSPEL Matthew 4:12-23

(For shorter form, read between > and <)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to
Matthew.

> Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus
went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth
he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside
town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali.
In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be
fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali!
Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan,
Galilee of the nations!
The people that lived in darkness
has seen a great light;
on those who dwell in the land and shadow
of death
a light has dawned.

From that moment Jesus began his
preaching with the message "Repent, for the
kingdom of heaven is close at hand." <
As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee
he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called
Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were
making a cast in the lake with their net, for
they were fishermen. And he said to them,
"Follow me and I will make you fishers of
men." And they left their nets at once and
followed him.

Going on from there he saw another pair
of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his
brother John; they were in their boat with

their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and
he called them. At once, leaving the boat and
their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee
teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming
the Good News of the kingdom and curing
all kinds of diseases and sickness among the
people.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Today's Gospel extract sets the scene for Jesus' ministry in Galilee. The introduction has been his baptism, when God revealed him as God's beloved Son, so we have been given a glimpse of Jesus' true identity.

John the Baptist leaves the Gospel narrative: we are told that he has been arrested or handed over, as Jesus will be in his turn. Matthew underlines the close connection between the two by presenting Jesus' message as identical to that of the Baptist. Jesus' moving to the town of Capernaum on the shores of the Sea of Galilee is guided by God's will, as shown by the quotation from the prophet Isaiah.

Jesus calls his first disciples. This is unusual, because normally a person would decide to become a disciple of a particular rabbi and join that teacher's circle. Here Jesus invites Peter, Andrew, James and John, who, except for Andrew, will be privileged witnesses to important events in the life of their Master. It is testimony to the human personality and attractiveness of Jesus that they spontaneously leave their secure and presumably prosperous employment and follow someone whom they have apparently just met.

Using Capernaum as his base, Jesus embarks on a preaching tour of the local synagogues, illustrating the arrival of the Kingdom of God by curing illnesses of all kinds. Thus begins his ministry in Galilee, the northern region of the land of Israel. ■

DO

Find a map of the Holy Land at the time of Jesus: there is probably one at the back of the Bible you use. When a town or region is mentioned in the Sunday readings, look it up on your map. This will help you to understand better the background to the ministry of Jesus.

LEARN

The "shadow of death" means deep, complete darkness.

Normally, disciples would choose the rabbi whose teachings they wished to follow: the rabbi did not seek out disciples.

In the Synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus makes one journey to Jerusalem, unlike the version of John which presents several visits.

SAY

The people that lived
in darkness have seen a
great light (Isaiah 9:2)

REFLECT

Matthew tells us that the first four disciples had no hesitation in leaving what was to them safe, secure and familiar in order to respond wholeheartedly to Jesus. The purpose of the church is to perpetuate the presence of Jesus Christ in the world. The church is the people of God, the disciples of Jesus. Mary, the mother of Jesus, is presented as the model of the church, which brings forth new disciples, new brothers and sisters for Jesus.

In many parts of the world, the Catholic Church is losing members, sometimes through people giving up the practice of the faith for a variety of reasons. But many people leave to join other Christian bodies and very often the reason has nothing to do with theology but with community and a sense of belonging to a group which celebrates its faith with joy and open conviction. Perhaps the past emphasis on individual piety and practice has left a deeper and more lasting mark than we realise. The attitude that we have to go to Mass can lead to people feeling that doing the minimum is sufficient to keep on the right side of God - or of the church authorities. If this is the thinking of a large number of the congregation, then this will create an atmosphere which visitors pick up very quickly.

Perhaps in our parish community we need to reflect more on the human attractiveness of Jesus and ask ourselves whether our kind of worship and relationships with one another truly present the Master whose disciples we claim to be. ■
