For your sake, for the sake of man, I became like a man without help, free among the dead. For the sake of you, who left a garden, I was betrayed to the Jews in a garden, and I was crucified in a garden.

The throne formed by cherubim awaits you, its bearers swift and eager. The bridal chamber is adorned, the banquet is ready, the eternal dwelling places are prepared, the treasure houses of all good things lie open. The kingdom of heaven has been prepared for you from all eternity.

Easter would entail some holiday time, going away to an interesting destination or to visit one's family. However, taking into account the circumstances that we find ourselves in, let us contemplate on the message of Easter: Christ, our Saviour, is risen to destroy our slavery to sin, bringing us into the freedom of life.

Rejoice! We are in the great feast!

Christ is Risen! He is truly Risen! Alleluia

Livestream Feedback - This has been wonderful! Thank you. We have had so many lovely messages. One email was from an American family of 5 who are quarantined in Madrid altogether unable to get home who discovered us and now follow daily. They forwarded details of our Guardian Angel prayer back to a friend who is an author in the USA and it has been added to her book entitled' Stations of the Cross with our Sister St Therese'.

Most Holy Redeemer - For those Parishioners who live in the Sawbridgeworth area, you may already be aware that here is a Corona Virus Action group involving the Council and Churches offering help and support to residents who may feel isolated or lonely.
