We heard Christ's promise to us at the end of the Gospel on Ascension Thursday this week:

"And know that I am with you always, yes, to the end of time."

You see God's time is the one that really matters, and God's time is synchronised with the very being of each and every one of us. It is a personal time that he knows is best for each of us and that is the time that God always chooses for us.

God chose to send us the gift of the Holy Spirit and next Sunday we celebrate that in the great Feast of Pentecost.

It is the hinge moment in the birth of the Church and the event that leads us forward in our Christian vocation. Please pray this coming week, as I shall, that we be open to God's Spirit and have that share of divine courage to act with it, because God's time is always right!

Good afternoon everyone

I hope that you are well.

Please find attached the Sunday message from Fr Peter, for this, the seventh Sunday of Easter, which has also been added to the news section of our website.

This week, at home, I came across a really lovely note book, which I had kindly been given by a friend some time ago. It was the type of note book that I had been saving to use for something special, and one that deserved to have time spent on it to ensure that it contained really neat hand writing and not my normal illegible scribble. As I thumbed through the pages, I noticed that some of them were printed with inspirational quotes, one of which caught my eye, 'No act of kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted'.

This past week has been Mental Health awareness week and the theme has been all about kindness. Kindness, as well as faith, has the power to create community, support and hope. We have seen kindness in abundance in our parish throughout the COVID-19 crisis from offers of practical help and prayer to support and friendship to those who are isolated.
