
Sunday Message on 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time from Fr Peter

I hope that you are all well.

Please find attached the Sunday Message for this week from Fr Peter which contains a great photograph taken from the roof of St Joseph's Church. The message can also be found on the news section of our website.

With the long summer evenings now having come to an end and with the crisp autumnal days having seemingly arrived, the sudden yearning for a bowl of chocolate pudding with hot creamy custard became something of a domestic emergency this week! I decided to embark upon finding a recipe in one of my many cookbooks on display, which look fairly impressive, but hide the simple skills of a somewhat average cook with inflated 'bake off' intentions. Flicking through the thumbed culinary pages of Delia, Ainsley, Mrs Beaton, Jamie and not forgetting Nigella, I then came across a cook book that I had helped to create for St Joseph's School many years ago as part of a fundraising activity when on the School Association Committee. It brought back happy memories of sitting very late one night with lovely Denise Matthews, who helped to type up and arrange the recipes, quotes and pictures kindly donated by Children, Teachers and Parents ready for printing. We had contacted Nick Nairns, the Celebrity Chef who kindly sent in his recipe for' Roasted vegetable flatbread pizza' and we had received a very special and tasty recipe from Canon Eddie RIP, accompanied by a short, personal and delightful note which we added to the book.

Having found the recipe that I was looking for, I started to get out my favourite mixing bowl and old-fashioned weighing scales with little brass weights, when disaster struck. I had run out of butter; my sparse bag of flour was lacking and there was a severe shortage of anything chocolate like in the house! Still craving a sugary blast, in desperation, I pulled out the contents of the back of a cupboard to see if I could find anything as a substitute. Hidden behind a giant bag of pasta shells, there was nothing suitable, but I did locate a square box containing a luxury, mature, boozy Christmas pudding- Bingo! That will do! Luckily it was one of those lazy puddings that rather than having to steam for hours, would easily fit into the microwave and within 8 minutes, the early festive October treat would be done. With my custard gently simmering on the hob, I reread the front of my now, flattened, recyclable pudding box and to my horror I noticed that the expiry date said, best before 2017! When the microwave went ' ping', I carefully examined the pudding with a courtesy 'sniff test' and with no apparent mold, fluff or weevils present and now accompanied by 100-degree molten custard, decided to test my constitution and eat it(having first served it to my unsuspecting, significant' taste testing' other, I might add!) Being even more 'mature' than intended, it was actually really tasty, having been safely preserved from the alcohol content within.

Apparently, the oldest Christmas pudding is 120+ years old and originated from the Boer war, having also been found in a family kitchen cupboard back in 2011 and is now on display in a museum in Portsmouth. Another one was reported to have been eaten dated 1969, which did make me feel a little bit better, although my cupboards have now had a thorough inspection with nothing else to report...

'The Canon's Concluding Concoction'

4 small slices of white bread 1 bunch of watercress 2 ripe pears 6oz(175g) of Stilton cheese freshly ground black pepper

Toast the slices of bread, trim off the crusts and put them in 4 individual ovenproof dishes.

Spead some watercress evenly over each slice.

Peel and core the pears, cut them in thin slices and arrange them on top of the watercress.

Slice the Stilton and cover the pears with it.

Put the savouries into a moderate oven (350F, 180C, mark 4) and cook for about 5 minutes until the cheese has melted.

Grind a little black pepper and serve hot.
