Sunday Message from Fr Antonio on 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Most of us have read the parable of the talents many times, and more likely than not we think of the talents referred to as representing our own gifts or abilities and that we should use them not for our benefit but for the good of others. A less common interpretation — equally valid and arguably more profound — is that the talents represent the priceless gifts of mercy and love that God so readily gives to us. And those gifts of mercy and love grow and multiply the more we use them and not when we hide or grow indifferent towards them.

We can understand this better with the aid of the first reading from the book of Proverbs about the "worthy wife". She is like the servant in the parable of the talents who doubled his five talents by using them. She works busily within her household and does so "with loving hands" (Proverbs 31:13). Instead of stopping there, she goes on to "reach out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy" (31:30). In other words, she does not bury the love and mercy that she receives from God. Instead, she gives them away to anyone who needs them.

God's precious gifts of mercy and love are given to everyone. This means that we all have the responsibility to open our hands and hearts to give them away to those around us. We receive love and so we should give love. We are shown mercy and so we should show mercy. And we should never think that we have given away enough love or mercy. We must keep sharing these gifts so that our circle of influence will grow larger and larger, just as the two men in the parable multiplied their talents by trading. Let us be inspired by Saint Teresa of Calcutta. She never tried to eradicate poverty, at least not by herself. The mission she set herself was to be with one person at a time. And, as we all know, her circle of influence affected the whole world, inspiring countless others to spread the gifts of love and mercy.

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday Message from Fr Antonio, for this week, the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, which tells us about the Parable of the Talents. This can also be found on the news section of our website.

This week, despite the lockdown, we have been able to safely open St Joseph's and Holy Cross for private prayer. It has been wonderful to continue to welcome back everyone and in particular, some of the younger members of our parish who have dropped in to say a morning prayer on their way to school between 8am - 9am on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. We have missed you and it is great to have you back!

The 'Microphone man' has been working in St Joseph's over the past couple of days to install a new microphone in the Choir loft and also to improve our speaker system. This has involved wires and cabling to be routed from the Sacristy, around the Church and under the floor via the circular grates, which needed to be lifted to allow easy access.

Whilst cleaning the Church and in an effort to assist, I lifted up the circular grate nearest to the Confessional boxes. There was a fair bit of fluff down there, but shining quite brightly through the dark, furry nest of downy deposits, I saw it... a one penny piece! Now, at a time when every penny really does count, I decided to fish the penny out of the hole, but it wasn't quite as easy as I had hoped. Having rolled up my sleeves and now being on my knees, I reached in with my hand, resembling a mechanical, seaside amusement grabber, feeling around the dusty cavern. Unfortunately, even at full stretch, I couldn't quite reach the penny, so, not wishing to be beaten, I lay face down on the now sanitised and well mopped, sterile floor, wearing my face mask and with my glasses now misted up on 'full sauna steam mode'. Going in the hole head first with my whole arm stretched out, I hoped that I would not become wedged. My mind momentarily raced back to 1988, when I witnessed an equally well-proportioned lady who had been delving in the bottom of the chest freezer in 'Bejam' in Watford, who unfortunately became stuck, wrestling with the frozen turkeys, eventually requiring the assistance of the fire service to get her out...

Thankfully... I managed to retrieve the penny and came back up to daylight. Having stirred up the fluff, I then saw another coin and this time it was a one-pound coin! The phrase ' in for a penny, in for a pound' struck a literal chord and so, in I went again and retrieved the 'confessional coffers', feeling rather chuffed, that the parish was now £1.01 up on the deal...

UPDATE RE THE NEW LOCKDOWN RESTRICTIONS

Unfortunately, due to the further COVID-19 restrictions and lockdown, we are **no longer able to gather for public worship from Thursday 5th November until 2nd December 2020** however...

Fr Peter and Fr Antonio Mass will continue to celebrate a daily and weekend Parish Mass at St Joseph's behind 'closed doors' albeit without a physical congregation being present. Mass will be live streamed on http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstortford so please do join us 'virtually'. Regrettably Mass will not be celebrated at Holy Cross or Most Holy Redeemer.

MASS TIMES AT ST JOSEPH'S VIA THE LIVESTREAMING

Monday- Friday Mass will be broadcast live at 9.30am

Saturday Vigil Mass will be broadcast live at 6pm

Sunday Mass will be broadcast live at 9am and at 11am with music and Cantor.

All of the Masses will be recorded and can be viewed at any time after the time of broadcast.

We have opened St Joseph and the English Martyrs Catholic Church and Holy Cross for private prayer, **initially** during restricted hours to start with, which may be subject to change.

A Steward/s will be in attendance to ensure that our Churches continue to remain COVID secure. Please observe the social distancing measures in place, using hand sanitiser and wearing a face covering (unless exempt) when visiting the Church. We ask you to respect also the capacity limits of 38 individual persons from separate households at any one time at St Josephs and 32 persons at Holy Cross. Our track and trace measures will continue, but there is no requirement to book a place for private prayer at this time. We have a QR Code on display already for those with a phone app or we will politely ask for your name and contact details upon arrival, so that individuals can be notified in the event of any suspected Covid-19 case.

Your details will be securely kept for 21 days to enable us to provide details to the trace & test system should an outbreak occur.

Music is an endless gift that keeps giving and it is a joy to have so many talented individuals in the parish who make such a difference each week and probably don't realise it. Thank you SO much! To finish this week, I have been back delving in the buried treasure of the Parish magazine archives and came across an article from July 1985 all about the 'Parish Penny Collection'. It started on 12th October 1975 with the aim of helping Fr Gerard Rishton C.S.S.R to raise £1000 to build a Church in the Rustenburg area of South Africa, with the money being raised by 16th January 1977. Our Penny collection is still going, 45 years on.. with the beneficiary of the 2020 Penny Collection being the MEDAILLE TRUST. This is a charity with strong Catholic roots and connections which works to support victims of modern slavery, mainly young women who have been trafficked to work in, for example, nail bars. It provides safe houses in various locations around the country and works closely with law-enforcement authorities. So, if you have any spare pennies.. or happen to find one tucked somewhere that you least expected to.. please remember that collectively, pennies can become pounds and make a real difference to the lives of those in need..
