Why is everyone running on Easter morning? Mary ran to Simon and the other disciple, who together ran to the tomb. The Easter announcement is an invitation to wake up and run, to go to the empty tomb and believe in the Risen Lord. Faith in the Risen One is an experience that is done together, never on our own.

Suffering, pain, and death are concrete and evident in our lives; the Resurrection, on the other hand, is a matter of faith. Faith is not reasoning; to have faith means trusting that there is a meaning behind all things, especially those incomprehensible to our mind, and our hearts. It's easy to feel close to the crucifix, to feel close to a person who suffers because each of us has experienced the suffering, the death of a person with whom we have woven a piece of life. It is easier to accompany Jesus on the path of pain than on the path of joy because joy and happiness are choices!

If we are here, it is because everything started from that race. It is the race of Mary Magdalene who runs to the Cenacle because she has to go to the disciples. He must tell what she saw. She still doesn't know that this announcement will change the course of history forever.

And then, another run: John and Peter running to the tomb. I imagine Peter and John running under the weight of fear, disappointment, and remorse. Peter, a few days earlier, had presumptuously said that he would give his life for the Lord, but three times he denied the Lord in front of a servant-girl and some bystanders. John, (younger!) arrives before Peter but lets him enter first. It's a race where someone gets there first but has the patience to wait for the other.

The first sign of Easter is an absent body, an empty tomb. God resurrected him so that it would be clear that love is stronger than death, and that a life based on love cannot experience death because, as the Song of Songs says, "Love is as strong as death". It is no coincidence that on Easter morning, those who had experienced the love of Jesus went to the tomb: the women, Mary of Magdala, the beloved disciple. It will be them, who had felt loved, who will be the first to understand that love conquers death.

The Lord is risen! And he is for everyone! He is Risen for those who feel abandoned by everyone, for those who cannot take their life back into their own hands, for those who have been taking care of their sick child for years. He is risen for those who, after months of hesitation, have made an important decision, for those who no longer have a family. He is risen even for those who never seek God. He is risen for you and for me!
