STATISTICS.

During 2019 there have been 45 Baptisms, 65 First Holy Communions,

41 Confirmations, **19** Funerals & 1 Wedding that took place here and preparation for **6** weddings which took place overseas. **Four** people were received into the Church through the RCIA process and **448** Masses have been celebrated (including school Masses).

Thank you to all our catechists who helped in the preparation of those who received he Sacraments here.
