Gospel Reflection

The lawyer who asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life was a student of Jewish religion and Jesus asks him what Jewish scripture teaches on the subject. We need to love God and love our neighbour comes the reply. The man answers his own question.

But the reality of Jewish practice was that only fellow Jews were considered neighbours; Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan challenges this. The priest and Levite are part of the religious establishment whereas the Samaritan is one of those largely despised and uneducated Jews, descendants of those left in Palestine during the Exile, whose religious "purity" was highly suspect.

According to Jesus' story, however, it is this religious outcast who has understood the importance of loving his neighbour, while the "religious" men, presumably concerned only about remaining ritually pure for service in the Temple, avoid any contact with the man needing help on the road.

Pope Francis made the Good Samaritan story a key part of his encyclical letter *Fratelli Tutti* (On fraternity and social friendship).

"A man assaulted by thieves and lying injured on the wayside. Several persons passed him by, but failed to stop. These were people holding important social positions, yet lacking in real concern for the common good. They would not waste a couple of minutes caring for the injured man, or even in calling for help. Only one person stopped, approached the man and cared for him personally, even spending his own money to provide for his needs. He also gave him something that in our frenetic world we cling to tightly: he gave him his time. Certainly, he had his own plans for that day, his own needs, commitments and desires. Yet he was able to put all that aside when confronted with someone in need. Without even knowing the injured man, he saw him as deserving of his time and attention.

Jesus trusts in the best of the human spirit; with this parable, he encourages us to persevere in love, to restore dignity to the suffering and to build a society worthy of the name."
