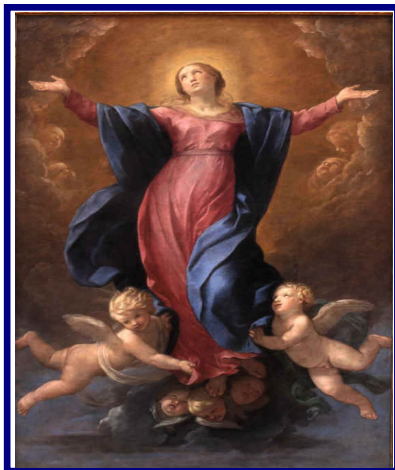

Gospel Reflection

We celebrate this Sunday the Solemnity of the Assumption and we rejoice that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven. This belief, going back to the early church, was declared an infallible doctrine in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory" Since Mary was without sin from conception to her death, her body did not face the corruption that comes with death.

Our Gospel today is the account of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. Part of the Elizabeth's greeting has been handed down as the Hail Mary, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." The child in Elizabeth's womb, John the Baptist, leaps for joy at the presence of Jesus in the womb of Mary. Mary's response is the prayer we now know as the Magnificat, proclaiming the greatness of the Lord and all that he has done for her.

Mary's Assumption is a sign to us of what, by God's grace, awaits us. By striving to imitate Mary's obedience to God's will, we can all live in the hope of eternal life in heaven. Like Elizabeth we should strive for holiness: a holiness that allows us to be sensitive to God's presence in our midst, and an awareness of God that moves us to prayer. When we approach the altar for Holy Communion we are truly in God's presence and the closer we get to him, the more our hearts will leap for joy. Like Mary may our souls magnify the greatness of the Lord. May we be always mindful of the great things God has done for us.

"The Mother of Jesus in the glory which she possesses in body and soul in heaven is the image and the beginning of the church as it is to be perfected in the world to come. Likewise, she shines forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come." (Vatican II Lumen Gentium)
