Gospel Reflection

In last Sunday's gospel, Jesus challenged attachment to worldly possessions. He told the parable of the foolish farmer who having experienced an abundant harvest is concerned solely with building bigger barns to keep it for the future. He doesn't think about sharing his good fortune or considering what actions in the present might make him rich in the sight of God. This week, Jesus tells his disciples that they must be like servants waiting for their master to return at any time.

After Jesus departed to heaven, there was a strong expectation that he would return very soon. By the time Luke's gospel was written, about 50 years after the death of Jesus, the Christian community had been waiting for Jesus' return much longer than they had originally hoped.

In those early years, the Christians waited for the return of Jesus much like the Jews waited on the first Passover night: dressed for action and ready to go. Their yearly celebration of Passover became a special time to contemplate Jesus' return in glory. This week's gospel encourages those waiting for Jesus to return to be patient, but ready.

Jesus asks his disciples to act in a way that would be very different from their contemporaries. They are to look to the future for their reward. Most people in Luke's community lived a day-to-day existence. There was no time to worry about the future. The Pharisees and the religious elite lived in a world that focused on the past, to maintain some sense of stability. Jesus is asking his disciples to live with watchfulness and a sense of fidelity that was uncommon in the day.

In Jesus' story, when the master does return, he sits down with the servants who have stayed awake, puts on an apron and waits on them. Just as Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, those who follow him and wait for his coming are doing God's work when they are serving others in humility.
