Gospel Reflection

In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells the story of two people praying in the Temple. One, a Pharisee, a strict observer of the Jewish Law, is telling God how good he is particularly when compared to the tax collector who is also praying in the Temple. By contrast, the tax collector prays simply and humbly "God be merciful to me, a sinner".

The Pharisees had disdain and contempt for others whom they regarded as irreligious. They felt qualified to sit in the seat of judgment and to condemn those who did not conform to their standards and religious practices. Tax collectors were generally disliked because they were able to force people into paying over the odds, whilst keeping a commission for themselves.

Yet Jesus tells us that because of the quality of their prayers, it is not the outwardly religious person who leaves the Temple at rights with God, but the very public sinner.

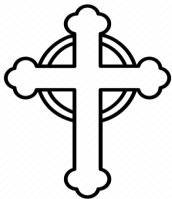
Jesus' parable speaks about the nature of prayer and our relationship with God. It does this by contrasting two very different attitudes towards prayer. The Pharisee, who represented those who take pride in their religious practices, exalted himself at the expense of others. Absorbed with his own sense of self-satisfaction and self-congratulation, his boastful prayer was centred on his own religious practices rather than on God's goodness, grace, and pardon. Instead of humbling himself before God and asking for God's mercy and help, he praised himself while despising those he thought less worthy. The tax collector, who represented those despised by religious-minded people, humbled himself before God and begged for mercy. His prayer was heard by God because he had true sorrow for his sins. He sought God with humility rather than with pride. Jesus' story teaches us that pride leads to self-deception and spiritual blindness. True humility helps us to see ourselves as we really are in God's eyes and it inclines us to seek God's help and mercy. It moves us to show kindness and mercy to others, especially those to whom we find it challenging to offer love and forgiveness.
