#### **Gospel Reflection**

Tax collectors have featured both in last week's Gospel and this week's. We remember the tax collector praying humbly and simply in the Temple last week and asking for God's forgiveness. This week we have the story of Zaccheaus, a senior tax collector and a wealthy man. He is so determined to see what kind of man Jesus was that he was prepared to be made fun of by climbing up a tree to get a good view of him. Jesus stops and talks to him: if Zaccheaus was somewhat conspicuous climbing a tree, he is now going to be the centre of attention of the crowd. He is a senior representative of a system which extorted taxes and his personal wealth will have been established by taking a cut from the taxes he collected. No pious Jew would want to be associated with a tax collector.

But Jesus asks to stay at Zacchaeus' house. This must have surprised Zacchaeus as much as it did the onlookers. The crowd think Jesus is wrong to go to the house of a sinner. But in response, Zacchaeus tells Jesus he is going to give half his property to the poor and repay anyone he has cheated four times over.

When Jesus saw Zacchaeus, he did not want to condemn him. When others wanted to judge, rebuke, and reject, Jesus saw a chance for mercy and salvation. Zacchaeus felt mercy and love when Jesus looked at him and it gave him confidence to ignore the hostility of the crowd and to accept Jesus' invitation to spend time with him.

No matter how many mistakes we may have made Jesus wants to spend time with us. There are many distractions and we may need to create our own space to try to get to know Jesus better. When we do, he will always respond with love and mercy.

## Senior Citizens Christmas Party – Saturday 26th November 12:30-5pm




