

GAUDETE

Rejoice in the

The third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday, taken from the Latin first word of the entrance antiphon of the Mass, "Rejoice in the Lord always." In Advent we prepare for the arrival of the Lord Jesus, both his first coming and his second coming, and by the third Sunday of Advent, we are most of the way through. We therefore rejoice as we see the goal of the season approaching: the Lord is near!

In our first reading Isaiah prophesies that the desert region will rejoice and sing: blooming with flowers. The wilderness "will see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God." Isaiah uses this nature imagery to convey the sense of joy that the Jewish people would experience upon their return from exile in Babylon. When the Lord comes, he says, "the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy."

In our Gospel, John the Baptist, who is in prison, sends messengers to Jesus to ask "Are you the one who is to come or should we look for another?" Jesus replies by telling them to report to John what they have seen: the blind see again, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. The very things which Isaiah said would happen when the Lord came are being fulfilled by Jesus.

John the Baptist's mission was foretold by the prophet Malachi: "I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you." Jesus says that among those born of women none has been greater than John the Baptist. Nevertheless "the least in the kingdom of heaven" is even greater.

In this we rejoice today, as members of Christ's mystical body, united in the bread we share and his love which binds us together.
