As we move closer to Christmas, today we hear in our Gospel John the Baptist preparing a way for the Lord. When the pregnant Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who was also expecting a child who would be known as John the Baptist, we are told that he lept in her womb when he heard the voice of Jesus' mother. Elizabeth and John were filled with the Holy Spirit. That same Spirit led John the Baptist into the wilderness where he was tested and grew in the knowledge of God. The Spirit prepared John for his mission as forerunner of Jesus, the Lamb of God who would take away the sins of the world.

Like the prophets of previous centuries, John spoke God's word to the people of Israel. To those unconcerned with the things of God, it was his work to awaken their interest, unsettle them from their complacency and arouse in them enough good will to recognize and receive Christ when he came. In a week where new statistics showed that less than half of people in England and Wales described themselves as Christian, we recognize that the work to promote the good news about Jesus is urgent in our own day.

What the prophets had carefully searched for and angels longed to see, came to completion as John made the way ready for the coming of the Messiah, God's Anointed Son.

John's baptism was for turning away from sin and taking on a new way of life. Our baptism in Jesus Christ by water and the Spirit results in a new birth and entry into God's kingdom as his beloved sons and daughters. The Lord Jesus gives us the fire of his Spirit so that we may radiate the joy and truth of the Gospel to a world in desperate need of God's light. His Spirit has power to change and transform our lives that we may be lights pointing the way to others. Like John the Baptist, we too are called to give testimony to the light and truth of Jesus Christ.


## **Confirmation 2023**
