Liturgy of the Word: 19th March 2023

Entrance Antiphon: Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her.

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. (Entrance Antiphon)

Rejoicing, exulting, being joyful: aren't we in Lent?! The 4th Sunday of the season is known as *Laetare* Sunday, from the Latin for *rejoice* which is the opening word of the antiphon with which Mass begins.

In the days when Lenten fasting was universal and rigorous, this day in mid-Lent provided a welcome approved break from the discipline and was sometimes known as *refreshment* Sunday. It was the Church's way of commending believers for their efforts and giving them a bit of a break before continuing on.

The 4th Sunday of Lent and the 4th Sunday of Advent are the only times in the Church's year when the priest wears pink or rose coloured vestments. Just as at this time of the year we sense the first signs of Spring, so too the Church invites us to take a reflective pause in our Lenten journey and imagine a glimpse of the Easter Sun which lies beyond Calvary.

Before the Reformation it was customary on this day to visit the "mother church" or Cathedral and this is thought to have established the connection with "Mothering Sunday" now more usually known as Mother's Day.

In our Gospel today, Jesus heals a man born blind and restores his sight. The Pharisees, in their spiritual blindness, cannot see beyond what they regard as Jesus doing wrong by healing on the Sabbath. They are angry that this man, whom they knew well as a blind beggar, should presume to tell them that Jesus is a prophet.

After he has been driven away by the Pharisees, Jesus seeks him out again. For the first time since he followed Jesus' instructions to wash in the pool, the man sees the Lord face to face. More than that, he sees who Jesus truly is. He worships the Lord.

Jesus will always give us light when we struggle to see. Lead, kindly light, lead Thou me on!
