All the readings today encourage us to place our faith and trust in God.

The prophet Jeremiah who faced betrayal and attacks even from trusted friends, nevertheless remains steadfast in his mission, demonstrating unwavering trust in God's care. We recognize that, like Jeremiah, we may encounter betrayal and attacks from those around us. However, our faith in God's unfailing care can serve as an anchor, sustaining us amidst tumultuous times. Jeremiah's story encourages us to hope that our own faith remains resilient in the face of challenges, opposition, and betrayal.

In the second reading, St Paul encourages us to place our faith in God's saving power and to find comfort and strength in the hope that comes from knowing His love and mercy. By embracing faith in Christ, we can overcome difficulties and find reassurance in the promise of salvation, even in the face of life's greatest challenges.

In the Gospel, Jesus forewarns his disciples about the trials and persecutions they will encounter as they carry out their mission of spreading his message. Nevertheless, he encourages his disciples to place their unwavering trust in God's love and protection. Jesus assures them that God knows them intimately, valuing each person with deep compassion and care. This message serves as a profound reminder of the love and concern God has for each one of us. As Jesus says: "every hair on your head has been counted".

In the trials of life, we are never alone, for God is intimately present and cares deeply for us. By wholeheartedly embracing and placing our faith in God's loving care, we can find solace, strength, and hope, knowing that our souls are safeguarded by the overflowing love of our Creator.
