

Liturgy of the Word: 16th July 2023

Entrance Antiphon: As for me, in justice I shall behold your face;

I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

Responsorial Psalm: Some seed fell into rich soil, and produced its crop.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia!

Speak, Lord, your servant is listening; you have the message of eternal life.

Alleluia!

Next week's Readings: Wisdom 12:13,16-19, Psalm 85 Romans 8:26-27, Matthew 13:24-30

Today's readings invite us reflect on the power of God's word. Isaiah tells us that God's word is like the rain and the snow, watering the earth and bringing forth its produce.

Jesus' parable of the sower in the Gospel is essentially optimistic: in spite of all of the lost seeds, the seeds which don't grow, the seeds which grow and then die, yet the seeds which fall on fertile ground produce an incredible harvest. Normal sowing of seed would yield perhaps a harvest seven to ten times as much as the seed. Jesus' description of a harvest of thirty, sixty or a hundred-fold shows the miraculous potential of God's Word.

When a person is sowing in a field, all the attention is on the accuracy of the sowing: on doing it well. God's grace strengthens us to live our lives well, carefully sowing the seeds of his gospel of love and proclaiming God's truth.

Jesus' story about the sower prepares us for the fact that not everyone will listen to us: not all seed falls on ground which will bear fruit. Even a lot of people who were able to hear Jesus in the flesh speaking God's word, chose not to follow him. Even if we sometimes feel that no one is listening to us, we remain faithful to the task of spreading God's word and giving our lives over him; keeping sowing the seeds of love as best we can.

What is certain is that there will be a harvest. God's word never returns to him without carrying out his will and succeeding in what it was sent to do. God himself will bring in the harvest; not necessarily in the way we might expect. God will make his word fruitful. God will transform the world. So today God invites us to give ourselves over as servants of the word for the sake of the kingdom. God invites us to proclaim our faith and to trust that his divine presence will renew the face of the earth.
