Today we celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. On top of a high mountain, lesus is seen to be transformed: his face shining like the sun and his clothes becoming as white as the light. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter confesses his belief that lesus is the Messiah and after lesus predicts his Passion, warning that anyone who would follow him must deny themselves and also take up the cross.

Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to the mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear and converse with lesus. Elijah and Moses are both significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the ten commandments. Moses represents the Law, which guides the lives of the lewish people. Elijah is one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh, and some believed that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. The appearance of these two figures from Israel's history indicated Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets. They also reveal that lesus is the fulfillment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

Upon witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, an awestruck Peter offered to construct three tents for them when a voice from a cloud affirms: "This is my Son; the Beloved; he enjoys my favour" and commands the disciples to listen to him. Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen on the mountain until after "the Son of Man has risen from the dead." Until they witnessed Jesus' passion and hanging on the cross, the disciples could not possibly understand what he meant by his rising from the dead.

The Transfiguration story anticipates Jesus' resurrection, gives a glimpse of Christ's glory in Heaven, and reminds us of the wonderful promise of our own resurrection.
