

Next week's Readings: Jeremiah 20:7-9, Psalm 62, Romans 12:1-2, Matthew 16:21-27

This liturgical year we have been making our way through Matthew's Gospel. Matthew, although placed chronologically first in the New Testament, is most likely a revised and expanded version of Mark's gospel. By supplementing Mark's writing with accounts of the life of Jesus he himself has heard, (among them the stories about Jesus' birth and the Sermon on the Mount), Matthew writes a gospel with a new focus and flavour.

Matthew is writing for a Jewish community. Jesus is presented as fulfilment of scripture, a recurring phrase throughout the Gospel. Matthew sprinkles the accounts of Jesus' birth with quotes from the Old Testament, making it clear that the expectations of the Messiah have now been fulfilled. In following Jesus then, Matthew is reassuring the Jewish community that they are not abandoning their heritage but discovering its full meaning.

First and foremost, Matthew's Jesus is the Messiah that Judaism had waited for, the one who ushers in the Kingdom of God.

Matthew shows Jesus as a new Moses, a new leader for the Jewish people. Matthew writes to show how Jesus imitates the key actions of his ancestor in faith; being kept from an untimely death as an infant, being called out of Egypt, and being the bringer of a new law on a mountain, this time beside Lake Galilee.

Matthew adds greatly to Mark's account of Jesus as teacher by including many teachings that Mark was not aware of. A significant example of this is the 'Sermon on the Mount' (Mt 5-7) where Matthew collects 18 lessons into one teaching scene.

As well as the Sermon on the Mount, where Jesus outlines of the life of discipleship in the new community, throughout Matthew's Gospel we are invited to spend time with the Lord "on the mountain".

On the mountain, Jesus rejects the devil and his temptations; at key points Jesus goes up the mountain to pray; on the mountain he was Transfigured; at Gethsemane on the mount of Olives he suffered grief and anguish and on the mountain his last words on earth were given: "Behold I am with you always, to the end of the world."
