Next week's Readings: Ezekiel 18:25-28 Psalm 24 Philippians 2:1-5 Matthew 21:28-32

In today's Gospel, Jesus has moved from Galilee to teach in Judea where he has been sought out by great crowds. Jesus has just encountered a rich young man who is unable to accept his demand that he leave his possessions to follow him.

On the surface, the parable of the workers in the vineyard appears to be an offense to common sense. Those who work a longer day ought to be paid more than those who work just an hour or two. When viewed in this way, the landowner seems unfair.

The landowner makes the point to those who worked the full day, that his agreement with those workers was honoured on the terms that were negotiated with them.

But he has also given a full-day's wage to those who worked only a single hour. No one is cheated, but a few receive abundantly from the landowner.

Those who worked all day complain that it is not fair that they should have worked long hours when these latecomers show up and get the same pay. The landowner challenges them: he paid them the agreed rate; is he not entitled to use his own money to be extravagantly generous to others if he wishes?

The latecomers had been waiting in the market place all day, we are told, but no-one had hired them. Perhaps these late comers are the older workers, those who are less fit, less physically able. Perhaps they include foreigners or strangers who were also overlooked when it came to hiring.

Jesus tells this story to illustrate, in a challenging way, that his Kingdom will turn the world upside down. The last will be first, and the first last.

Mary in her Magnificat, her great prayer of praise to God, recognises that she has been chosen, though a humble handmaid, and that the Lord God has put down the mighty from their thrones and raised up the lowly.

"He bestows gifts lavishly on the poor; his righteousness will endure forever". (Psalm 112)
