Next week's Readings: Jonah 3:1-5, 10 Psalm 24 | Corinthians 7: 29-31 | Mark 1: 14-20

In our first reading we hear about the young prophet Samuel, who lived some 1000 years before Jesus. He mistook God's call for that of his mentor Eli, the priest and judge. It took some time for Eli and Samuel to understand that it was God who was calling the young Samuel.

"Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him," we are told, indicating that the prophetic mission Samuel was taking on was under God's watchful care. The young prophet is dedicated to the Lord, ready to listen, and God cares for this chosen one.

In time the fame of Samuel as a prophet spread throughout Israel and was legendary. Samuel would eventually anoint the first kings of Israel, Saul and then David, thereby transforming the entire history of the people of God.

By Samuel anointing kings, the twelve tribes of Israel were more firmly united. The ideal was the amalgamation of the people into a single family, so that all their actions would be a form of worship and praise of the one God.

In the second reading today St Paul stresses that followers of Christ are also to form a bond of union and strive for holiness together, thereby becoming a temple of the Lord, made up of many individuals who are also temples of God's Holy Spirit. When sin is avoided and doing good abounds, followers of Christ are acting in accord with God's will and building up the temple of the Holy Spirit, offering right worship to God.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus asks his first disciples, and asks each of us as well: "What do you want?" Jesus adds, "Come and see". He is always inviting us to get to know him better.

Like Samuel, we do not always hear God speaking to us, but that is because we are not listening properly. God is always calling us. Our prayer is the same as Samuel's: "speak, Lord, your servant is listening".
