

Liturgy of the Word: 10th March 2024

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. (Entrance Antiphon)

Rejoicing, exulting, being joyful: aren't we in Lent?! The 4th Sunday of the season is known as Laetare Sunday, from the Latin for rejoice which is the opening word of the antiphon (or introit) with which Mass begins.

In the days when Lenten fasting was universal and rigorous, this day in mid-Lent provided a welcome approved break from the discipline and was sometimes known as refreshment Sunday. It was the Church's way of commending believers for their efforts and giving them a bit of a break before continuing on.

The 4th Sunday of Lent and the 4th Sunday of Advent are the only times in the Church's year when the priest wears pink or rose coloured vestments. Just as at this time of the year we sense the first signs of Spring, so too the Church invites us to take a reflective pause in our Lenten journey and imagine a glimpse of the Easter Sun which lies beyond Calvary.

Before the Reformation it was customary on this day to visit the "mother church" or Cathedral and this is thought to have established the connection with "Mothering Sunday" now more usually known as Mother's Day.

In Rome, for centuries people have made a pilgrimage to a different Church each day to attend Mass (The Rome Lenten station Masses). On Laetare Day Mass was always celebrated at the Basilica of Santa Croce in Gerusalemme (The Holy Cross of Jerusalem) so named because Emperor Constantine's Mother St Helen built a chapel there to house relics of the Cross which she had found on Mt Calvary. It may be in part due to this that Jerusalem features prominently in our lectionary today.

May our hearts be filled with joy as we recognise that our promised destiny is the heavenly Jerusalem: let us prize that Holy City above all our joys.
