Peter was especially chosen on that day when his brother Andrew brought him to Jesus. The early Church acknowledged this fact and held Peter's office, as the guardian of unity, in high esteem. When Saul, heard the Risen Jesus ask the question 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?', this former persecutor of "the Way" became the Apostle to the Gentiles.

Around the year 66AD Peter was crucified upside down on the Vatican Hill. His body was laid to rest in a nearby cemetery. It was over this place, several centuries later that the first Basilica of St Peter's was built. This basilica was replaced by the structure that we know so well today. Interestingly, the site of Peter's tomb was discovered in the 1960's and it was found to lie directly beneath the great High Altar and Baldachino from which the Holy Father celebrates Mass. The Apostle Paul suffered martyrdom at the hands of Roman authorities between 65 and 67 A.D. He was buried by the Christian faithful. About 250 years later the Emperor Constantine built a Basilica built over his tomb. It was Peter's role to be a focus of unity. Reminding each of us that we are bound together in service by the love of Christ. Peter was to exercise his authority benignly. He was to be a builder of bridges uniting communities in belief so that they would hold firm to the traditions which Jesus gave them and which the church developed.

Paul was called to be a missionary to all the nations, proclaiming that through the risen Christ all divisions are swept away. He wrote that in Christ, "there is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Gal 3.27 & 28).

On this great feast we not only give thanks for the mission and witness of these two wonderful saints but we also pledge ourselves to imitate them and become, in the words of Pope Francis, "missionary disciples".
