Our Church

Originally built in 1896 as the Church Rooms for St Mary's Parish Church in Churchgate, the building has been used for many purposes during its history. Cheshunt residents, now retired, remember having their school dinners in the building and also attending dances there. After the Second World War many young Italians, who had come to the area to work in the market garden industry in the Lea valley, set up home permanently in Cheshunt. These Catholic families, along with others from Poland and Ukraine, needed their own place of worship and the building became the Mass Centre or 'Chapel of Ease' run by the Italian Mission under the auspices of St Joseph's Waltham Cross. During the last quarter of the twentieth century the nurseries moved out of the Lea Valley, the greenhouses were demolished and a massive building programme on these brownfield sites greatly increased Cheshunt's population. congregation grew to such an extent that an application was made to Westminster to make St Paul's a Parish in its own right. This was granted in 1990s. There have been plans to move to larger premises on more than one occasion over the years, but this has never materialised. Today St Paul's retains its unique 'country church' atmosphere but is nevertheless a vibrant welcoming congregation of all ages and nationalities

Our Worship

There are three masses held over the weekend. Hymns are sung at all Masses and at the 11.00 am on Sunday parts of the Mass are also sung. A children's liturgy is run during the 11.00 am mass – the children go into another part of the church after the opening hymn and return after the offertory. They share with the congregation what they have been learning and praying about.

You are also welcome to join us at our weekday Masses. During Lent we say the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 9.00 am.

A prayer group meets every first Wednesday of the month at 7.00 pm
