A **blue envelope** (if you can gift-aid) or a **brown envelope** (if not gift-aided).

Return it to Fr. Ivano or place it through the Presbytery letterbox.

During the month of November, we will pray for all our loved ones who have died.

Parents and grandparents. Husband and wife. Brothers and sisters.

Friends and all those whose memory we cherish.

We will pray for those who in life we have found hard to love or impossible to forgive.

Those who hurt us and did cause us to suffer. Our enemies.

Through prayer and faith, we can be reconciled with those who have died.



A **Plenary Indulgence** for the souls in purgatory is granted when visiting a cemetery, praying for the repose of the soul of those who have died, on one of the days from 1<sup>st</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> November - or simply by praying mentally for the dead.

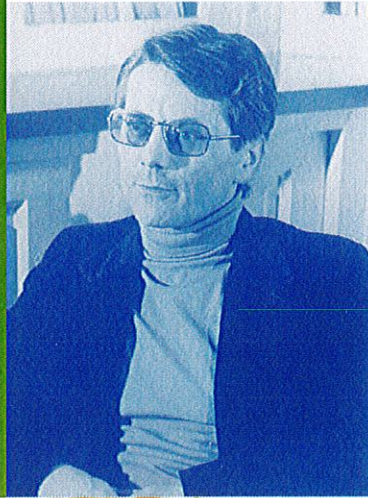
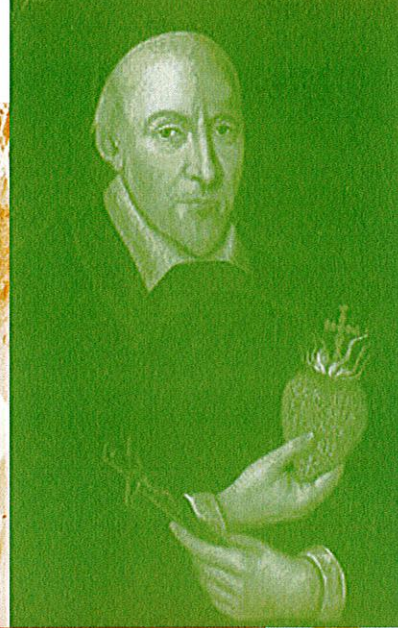
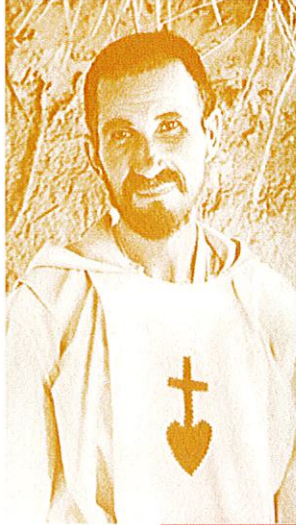
