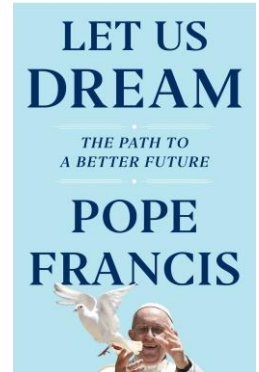

LET US DREAM

I want to recommend a new book to you - *Let Us Dream* by Pope Francis. As the book's subtitle indicates, it is a call and a vision for *the path to a better future*. The Pope sees the Covid crisis as "a moment to dream big, to rethink our priorities – what we value, what we want, what we seek – and to commit to act in our daily life on what we have dreamed of," Only in following this path can we hope to find a way forward through the many crises our world now faces – ecological, economic, political, and human.

Below are two passages to encourage you to read the book and to begin to "dream big" together with your family and neighbours.



From this crisis we can come out better or worse. We can slide backward, or we can create something new. For now, what we need is the chance to change, to make space for the new things we need. It's like God says to Isaiah; "Come, let us talk this over. If you are ready to listen, we will have a great future. But if you refuse to listen, you will be devoured by the sword" (Isaiah 1:18-20).

It's a task for all of us. ... We need a movement of people who know we need each other, who have a sense of responsibility to others and to the world. We need to proclaim that being kind, having faith, and working for the common good are great life goals that need courage and vigour ... We need to focus on fraternity to confront the challenges ahead.

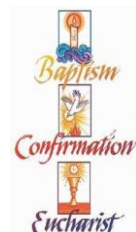
