# EASTER SUNDAY year B

We all remember the letter of Francis Evangelii Gaudium where the Pope laments on "Christians whose lives seem like Lent without Easter." What is the joy of the resurrection? Why should we be joyful in Eastertide, besides the springtime and the possible end of the pandemic?

Each Easter, the song of the Exsultet that we sing at the beginning of the Vigil mass gives me the same impression. I experience both a difficulty to understand, and the certainty that "this is it, here is the key of the joy of the resurrection," every time I hear these words in the liturgy:

"Our birth would have been no gain, had we not been redeemed.

O wonder of your humble care for us! O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave you gave away your Son!

O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ!

O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!"


Christian theology says that if mankind had not been sinful, there still would have been the Incarnation of the Son, in order to fulfil God's design to dwell in the midst his creatures and make them participants of his divine glory. But the truth is that we have sinned. Because of our sin, the coming of Jesus was not only an extraordinary gift of God coming to us, but it was also an incredible proof of the immensity of God's love for us.

As Paul states:

"If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ... For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:32-38)

This is the mystery we celebrate at Easter, and this is the source of our joy. Because of the cross, because of the resurrection, we know that our sin becomes the place where God can manifest his glory. For this reason, we are not afraid to say "happy fault that earned so great a Redeemer!"
