The parable Jesus tells to the chief priests and elders in the Gospel is not just a story, it is a foretelling of the deceitful and murderous intentions of his listeners. They will, like the tenants take Jesus, the landowner's son, and put him to death on the wood of the cross so as to insure they inherit the vineyard. The teaching from the Gospel is that in a world where fear and favour jostle for advantage is that we persevere in goodness. St. Paul, in his letter to the Philippians today promotes the way of goodness that we need to follow "fill your minds with everything that is true....everything that can be thought virtuous." "keep doing all the things that you learnt from me" in this way the God of peace will always be with us. It is not and will not be easy, but it is the best and only way.
