Dear Parishioners,

If you are attending 6.00pm Mass, don't forget to put your clocks back one hour. If you were early for 8.00am or 10.30am Mass I trust you spent some extra time in prayer!

Growing up in Poplar as a child I saw the beginnings of Neighbours in Poplar, on my return I have seen how it has grown. The question is, have we become more neighbourly or has the need for public neighbourliness grown because too many people are caught up in caring for themselves rather than others? Are we more concerned about our social media profile, what people are saying on X/Twitter, than the needs of the lonely person living next door? Do we know their name?

In his response to the Pharisees question, Jesus uses familiar scripture passages from Deuteronomy (6:5) and Leviticus (19:8) but linking them together was something new, perhaps not quite the answer they wanted or would have liked the law and the prophets to hang upon. There are some who would say that it is easier to love the neighbour you can see than to love the God you can't! However it should be our love of God which compels us to love our neighbour, and the greater our neighbour's need the greater our love must be.

Perhaps that is the challenge we must respond to, the challenge that Neighbours in Poplar have been responding to, because the growth in secularism, lack of the love of God means no one else will!
