All todays readings are concerned with the authenticity of the word of God, with the reception of it and the response to it. Malachi delivers an impassioned condemnation of neglect in worship and infidelity to God. Paul struggles to describe the fellowship his ministry calls him to exercise and foster among those he meets and teaches. Jesus himself warns against empty religious practice and emphasises the sovereignty and supremacy of God and tells us that our attitude in all things should be one of service and humility and God will do the rest.
