Mission and Discipleship

The Lord sends out his disciples on mission. He provides them with some instructions, how they are to travel light and announce a message of peace. He empowers them to heal the sick and to announce that 'the Kingdom of God is very near to you'. There is the expectation of hospitality not just towards the disciples but to the message they carry. An important aspect of the mission endeavor is team work. The disciples are sent out in pairs. It is going to be a collaborative effort.

Apparently the disciples employed much success in their mission. They come back rejoicing. They say 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name'. Jesus wants them to cool that sense of joy. 'do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you: rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven!'. Unlike those disciples perhaps Jesus knew that the mission wasn't going to be that easy. It would indeed turn out to be a rocky road ahead. The audience would not always be hospitable. There would be persecution and martyrdom ahead. Jesus is the one who shows the way. It is the way of love, the way of the cross, that leads to glory.

There has been no change in the mission of the Lord. It is the same mission of discipleship where we are all called to go forth. We are all called as Pope Francis puts it to be missionary disciples. The prayer of the Lord himself is very pertinent in our modern context 'the harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest'. It's a prayer for vocations but also a prayer for people to involve themselves in every aspect of mission. In all our different roles we are sent out ahead of him. We are parents, educators, social workers, nurses, whatever. We all have a role to play in the mission of the Church. The church is you and me and the mission is the Lord's.

Just as Jesus sent out his disciples to continue his work, so he sends us. He gives us a message to convey not only in terms of words but in terms of lifestyle. Our love in action reflects our discipleship of the Lord. Let us be mindful that the Lord himself is very close to us, egging us on through his spirit, in our missionary endeavor. **Fr John**
