Monday 27th St.Vincent De Paul 1580-1669. son of French

peasants, ordained priest. His sermons and work with the poor attracted wide attention, Founded the Vincentians and Sisters of Charity. His life was devoted to the alleviation of suffering and misery; left a network of charitable works and workers that endures to this day.

## Tuesday 28th Feria

Wednesday 29th SS Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, archangels. In Daniel Michael is the guardian of Israel. In the Apocolypse Michael and his angels overpower Satan and his angels in the great struggle. Gabriel is the archangel who announces to Mary that she is to be the mother of God. Raphael in Tobit provides aid to a devout Jewish family under difficulty and hardship.

Thursday 30th St.Jerome, 342—420, a great biblical scholar. Translated the Bible into Latin Vulgate. Spent most of his life in Bethlehem from where he sent his luminous writings upon the Christian world. He said "to be ignorant of the scripture is not to know Christ."



## 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2021 Children of the Kingdom

Last weekend we celebrated two First Holy Commun-

ion Masses in the parish. We give thanks for that and we continue in a spirit of thanksgiving today with a Mass of Thanksgiving. The one we thank is God Himself of course for giving us everything that we have but above all for giving us his Son Jesus as Lord and Saviour, the Jesus we receive in Holy Communion. The disciples in today's gospel show concern that somebody else has invaded their patch. They try to stop him but fail and pass the matter on to Jesus. Remember these disciples are still not fully in touch with Jesus and are more concerned about self promotion. What they don't realise is that in endeavouring to guard their privilege they are in fact obstructing the cause of Jesus. For Jesus the key is service and it doesn't matter who does it or where it comes from. If the work is being done in his name as it appears to be by this outsider, then that's okay with Jesus. Rather than casting the person aside Jesus embraces him and affirms the work he is doing. The lesson in inclusion must have had some impact on these disciples that the reign of God is not as they see it. Jesus is certainly firing his disciples in a new direction here. They were a stumbling lot and so are we. He dramatizes how best we might find the right direction to get back on his track. Jesus proposes a way which is his and this provides the context for discipleship. It means keeping our eyes on the ball that is Jesus himself. He wants everybody to play his game which is essentially that of service. He didn't want to put down his own disciples. It was just that his approach was so different to them. The power and status temptation always exists. The Cross serves as a counter cultural reminder that true service lies within that mystery. "Anyone who is not against us is for us" says Jesus.
