On Good Shepherd Sunday let us respond to God's call and renew our dedication to serving the Lord and our brothers and sisters.

First Reading. Acts. God has made him both Lord and King. Psalm. The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I Shall want. Second Reading. You have come back to the shepherd of your souls. Gospel. I am the gate of the sheepfold.

In the Middle East it was the task of the shepherd to find water and pasture and to ensure safety. In your life who have been the people that have nourished you and given you security. For whom have you done this?

Important to the shepherd's ability to give security to the sheep is the fact that he was known and familiar to them. They recognised his voice. Does that resonate with you? We are familiar with the image of Jesus as the shepherd. The image of Jesus at the door or gate is not so familiar. Jesus presents himself at the door through which we pass and find life. At what doors have you found this life? Was it a situation, a place, a book, an experience, a person? For whom have been a door to a richer life?
