Gospel Notes. Matthew 22:15-21. The story sees a mixture of religion and politics, a potentially explosive combination. Jesus does not ask us to avoid politics but that our involvement in the affairs of the world be informed by the perspective of the reign of God. Pharisees and Herodians were not natural allies but a shared dislike of Jesus brought them together in an attempt to discredit him. Jesus did not get into an argument with them but simply professed his belief in the priority of God. Jesus recognises that we can be faced with conflicting claims for attention. He does not tell us how to solve this dilemma but challenges us to make sure that our allegiance to God takes priority. When have you been faced with a conflict of loyalties?
